Of that, \$1,482 has been spent on CAC outreach, zero funding has been spent on the video thus far, and \$95.99 was spent supporting the Strawberry Island event. An additional approximately \$700 may be spent on T-Shirts for the waterfront cleanup very soon.</p> <p>Four new or revised panels have been created for the AOC display. A mass of printed outreach materials were procured at no cost, including posters, brochures, and watch cards. Many have been distributed. Purchased outreach materials include, 1,050 refrigerator magnets, 516 chip clips both emblazoned with the Menominee CAC's logo. One hundred stop invasive hitchhikers bobbers were also purchased. Many clips and magnets have been distributed, 100% of bobbers have been distributed.</p> <p>Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) members have spent 42.75 man hours presenting the AOC display. They have presented it at two events for the course of six days. Staff from WDNR have assisted in presenting the display, bringing the totals up to 56.75 man hours, three events, and seven days of presentation.</p> <p>UW-Marquette partnered with the Bureau of Land Management, NestEgg Marine, and WDNR to control invasive buckthorn and honeysuckle on Strawberry Island September 15th. Labor was provided by twenty-four UW-Marquette students under the direction on BLM and WDNR staff. Man-hours during the event totaled 72, of which 60 were volunteer hours. New panels for the display were also paid for out of that grant by the County. A fish consumption advisory handout was developed by WDNR science services through other commitments. This grant has benefited from all these actions without having to provide for them financially, resulting in leftover funding. The CAC will use leftover and additional funding to produce a short video on the environmental and economic benefits of removing contaminated sediment in Menekaunee Harbor.</p> <p>An outreach opportunity was missed in July when family and business emergencies kept CAC members from participating. That event would have resulted in an additional 6-8 man hours presenting the AOC display. Poor weather conditions may have suppressed volunteer participation in the waterfront cleanup.</p>

In addition to spending, \$3,000 was transferred to the Menekaunee Harbor Sediment Video Project, leaving \$1918.49 remaining unspent. Funding allocations are as follow: \$867.47 spent purchasing giveaway items for the educational display, \$618.05 spent on trash disposal, supplies, and promotion for the waterfront cleanup, 95.99 was spent erosion control for the Strawberry Island event, and no funding was spent purchasing waterfront cleanup T-shirts. A lot has been accomplished through this grant. A mass of printed outreach materials were procured at no cost, including posters, brochures, and watch cards. Approximately 30% of which were distributed from the educational display. Purchased outreach materials include 1,050 refrigerator magnets and 516 chip clips, both emblazoned with the Menominee CAC's logo. 			<p>supported the effort through the donation of waterproof latex gloves to be used in conjunction with cut resistant gloves purchased with grant funding. Approximately 10 cubic yards of garbage was removed from local waterfront. In addition, 1 large television, 2 medical syringes, and 3 tires were also removed and properly disposed of. The Menominee Yacht club donated a meeting space and the Marinette Menominee Manufacturing Association donated pizza for lunch.</p> <p>Four new or revised panels have been created for the AOC display, materials for storing and transporting the display, handouts, and giveaways were supplied at no cost by Marinette County through leftover funding from a MI grant. A fish consumption advisory handout was developed by WDNR science services through other commitments. UW-Extension paid for all 75 waterfront cleanup T-shirts.</p> <p>Many activities proposed by this grant were completed by external partners without using grant funding. Although the grant was not fully spent down, all proposed activities have been accomplished. Some of the leftover funds have been re-allocated to produce a short video on the environmental and economic benefits of removing contaminated sediment in Menekaunee Harbor.
